

“Cross Clubbing” for Projects

(to enroll in projects not available in the “home” unit (club))

A 4-H member who is currently enrolled in a Community Club and who wishes to enroll in a project not offered by the “home” club may under the following conditions, “cross club” to another club offering the desired project.

Conditions, Requirements, and Procedures:

- ✓ The member must be currently enrolled, with fees paid, at the “home” club.
- ✓ The desired project **MUST NOT** be offered at the “home” club.
- ✓ The member and parents **MUST** get the (cross club) project leader’s permission to enroll the member in the second club’s project.
- ✓ In addition, a Cross club Project Enrollment form must be completed and signed by BOTH Community Club leaders (both home and cross club) and the project leader for the cross club project.
- ✓ The form **MUST BE STAPLED** to the top of the completed enrollment packet when submitted to the club.

It is **NOT SUFFICIENT** to simply write the name of the project on your club’s enrollment paperwork. The 4-H Office must have confirmation that the Project Leader for the cross club project **KNOWS** you intend to enroll in that project and will be attending project meetings. The Project Leader also needs contact information (telephone number and e-mail) for the member.

After enrollment data input is completed, the cross club project enrollment will appear on both (home and cross club) rosters for members cross clubbing for projects.

The County 4-H Office has received the following inquiry a few times; “I’ve been told that once a club has 2 or 3 members cross clubbing for the same project, the home club has to provide the project rather than the members cross clubbing. Is there a policy that states this?” The answer is: No, there is no limit or requirement to how many members from one club may Cross Club for the same project.

CROSS CLUB PROJECT ENROLLMENT FORM

1. The project in question is **not currently offered by the “home” club.**
2. The Cross club project leader approves the crossover.
3. **Both** Community Club leaders approve this crossover by signing this form.
